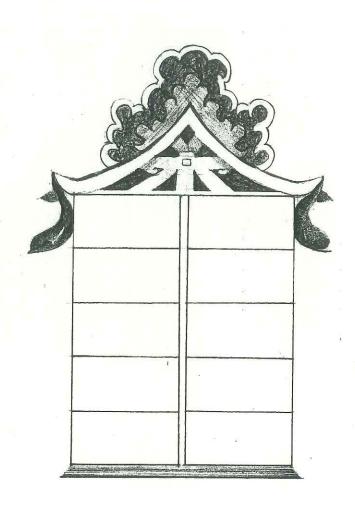
Set on a deserted, dying spaceship in the Asteroids, *King of Space* tells the story of Tam Rosse, warrior against the Emperor of Terra. To survive, Rosse must rescue the ship from its mad ancient master, "King" Brady. The other human on the ship, the Priestess of Pallas, will give Rosse power over Brady and the ship—but the Priestess is the Emperor's ally, and her price is Rosse's free will. Which of the humans will win, and how? And how will any of them deal with Brady's inhuman lover, the ship herself?

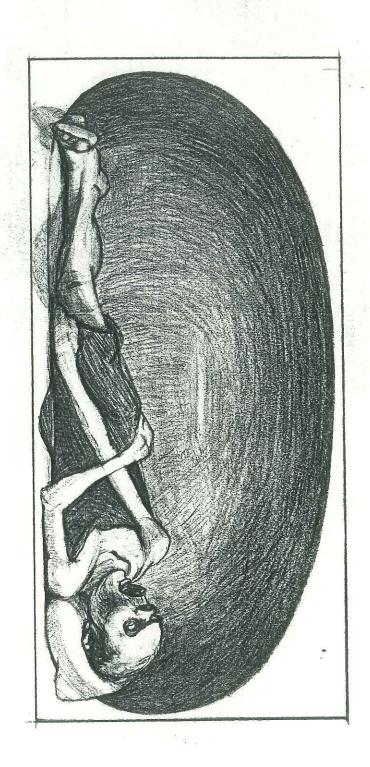
Sarah Smith is also one of the authors of the innovative SF novel *Future Boston*, to which she contributed four stories; one of these, "Three Boston Artists," was recently published in *Aboriginal SF*. Other authors of this science fiction novel include Nebula winners Geoffrey Landis and James Morrow, Philip K. Dick finalist D. Alexander Smith, and regular *Asimov's* contributor Alexander Jablokov. WGBH is planning to do a program about this novel in its "Twenty-First Century" series.

She is working on a new SF interactive for children and on *Stars*, a paper-based novel set in the same world as *King of Space*. Her Victorian Boston mystery, *The Child Killer*, is under consideration for publication in 1991 or 1992. She holds a Ph.D. in English from Harvard University, where she created her own course of study in experimental fiction; she also studied at the Slade Film School in London. Her company, MediaSmith, designs and creates documentation and online training. She lives in Brookline, Mass., with her husband and kids, four computers, and a 22-pound Maine Coon Cat, Vicious.

King of Space is a hypertext science fiction novel, set in a deserted spaceship among the Asteroids. Tam Rosse, political criminal, needs the spaceship to save a revolution. But to get it, he must fight "King" Brady, the only human aboard the ship, and the the ship's half-mad interface, the semi-human Lady Nii. Tam Rosse is himself being hunted by the virgin Priestess of Pallas, who needs a lover, bodyguard, and slave.

King of Space breaks new ground in science fiction. Neither a traditional game nor a conventional novel, it mixes literature with animation, mazes, puzzles, and games. It is extensively illustrated by Matt Mattingly. Programming development was headed by Mark Bernstein, developer of HyperGate; the award-winning music is by Michael Druzhinsky.

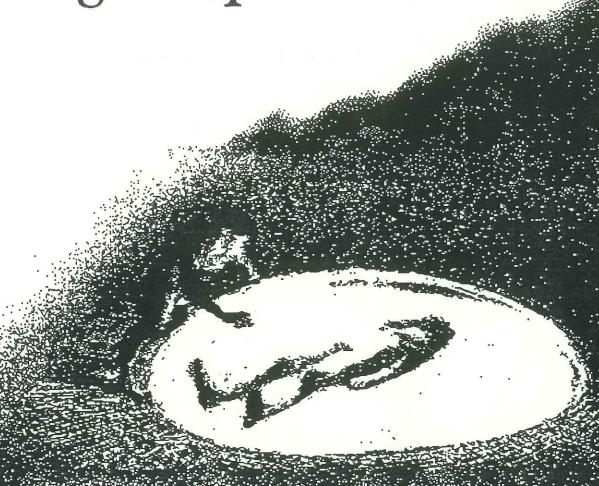
Sarah Smith has also written a novel, The Vanished Child, about murder, amnesia, sex, and redemption in turn-of-the-century New England, which Ballantine will publish in hardcover in Spring 1992. She has recently finished a collaborative novel, Future Boston, written with authors including Nebula winners Geoffrey Landis, Philip K. Dick Award finalist D. Alexander Smith, and regular Asimov's contributors Alexander Jablokov and Steven Popkes. Her Future Boston story, "Three Boston Artists," made the 1990 Recommended Reading lists of Locus and Aboriginal.. She is currently working on a novel, The Bunraku Stars, set five years after King of Space, and on a children's interactive fiction, Radiator. She lives in Brookline, Mass., with her husband, two children, and a 22-pound Maine Coon cat, Vicious. To keep Vicious in cat food she writes manuals and educational hypermedia. She is an active member of the Science Fiction Writers of America and the Cambridge Speculative Fiction Workshop.

King of Space is published by Eastgate Systems, which publishes and distributes software and hypermedia literature for the Macintosh, including Michael Joyce's Afternoon. It also distributes StorySpace, an advanced authoring system for hypermedia.
