Readers get a choice between "directions" ("click yes") or to "start" ("press Return"). There is a menu at the top of the page that contains "cover" "<" and ">" followed by a button for "Yes" and a button for "No". It also combines both the Title Screen and Start Screen. The Tool Bar is retained in the 10 th Edition though has changed slightly: like the Tool Bar from the 3 rd and 4 th Editions, it contains the "back arrow", "links icon", and the "Yes" and "No" button options; unlike the previous Tool Bars, this one offers an "H" or home button and eliminates the "printing" option.

								<p>The Tool Bar is eliminated in the 12th Edition but there is a Menu Bar at the top of the interface that contains some of the elements of the Tool Bar, including the "back" button and the "yes" and "no" buttons. There is also the main menu at the top of the screen that allows readers to "Browse Links" from the "View" item. The 12th Edition is reminiscent of Windows approach to navigation.</p> <p>Additionally, 12th Edition maintains the clean interface of the 11th Edition but incorporates elements from the 7th such as the elimination of the Tool Bar, which had been a staple feature of all editions created for the Macintosh platform</p>
